They used to say you want to be done and off this heavy land by the end of October. Well, we had all but 3 acres of ours ploughed up this time and well before then. I was feeling quite pleased, we'd made good progress when the rains started and, before long there was standing water everywhere. This soon made veg. harvesting a very difficult job, the rigs dropping through and getting stuck, and really abusing the land.

Tractors and equipment have all become too big and heavy, not only for the land but also for the roads. These were never designed for such loads and were intended mainly for horses and carts.

It's not just the fields that are waterlogged, but also our verges. This became very obvious recently following two accidents on the A52 on consecutive days. Diverted traffic, often still travelling at A52 speeds, and meeting on single track roads, have ruined the grass verges which will take some time to recover.

Luckily we'd got all our cattle into the yards by 28th October, and in very good condition due to the abundance of grass this season. I hope that won't mean calving problems and we are due to start before long.

This morning, Remembrance Sunday, began with thick fog and frost. Our service this year was at Leverton Church, taken by Rev. Andrew and was well attended.

I've seen good flocks of fieldfares, here for the abundant berries, but they appear to have moved further inland. There are still plenty of pinkfeet geese about but, having gleaned most of the local maize fields, are coming in much higher and, I expect, flying further to find new feeding grounds.

A friend, who lives near our church and has a wildlife pond, tells me he has a second 'brood' of tadpoles this year, something I have never known in the past. We are often hearing of different species moving in from the continent – likely due to global warming I expect. Perhaps this is just another example.

Peace On Earth - Goodwill To All

As we approach Christmas so we sing Christmas Carols and many include the word "peace", "It came upon a midnight clear... Peace on earth Good will to all" or "Hark the Herald Angels sing, Glory to the new born king. Peace on earth..." and in verse 3 "Hail the heaven born Prince of Peace"

WRANGLE YOUTH CLUB - 75 years on and still going strong

The 75th anniversary celebration for the Wrangle Youth Club was a remarkable achievement and a wonderful event for all who attended, including members (both past and present), leaders, helpers and friends of the club.

The club has come a long way since its establishment in 1948, starting as a small initiative by the Wrangle Lowgrounds Womens Institute and growing into a thriving community organisation. The arrangement with Batemans Brewery, many years later, to secure a piece of land and organise the re-construction of two former Army Huts from Roughton Moor and the efforts of the Youth Club members in supporting with the internal fittings, showcase the dedication and resourcefulness of the community.

The foresight of Management Committees and the dedicated fund-raising, by all that followed, enabled the club to develop the site and it's heartening to know that young people have a safe and secure environment at Wrangle Youth Club, where they can have fun and develop new skills.

Well, deservedly, in 2015, long-standing leaders of the club, Bert and Barbara, were awarded with British Empire Medals to show recognition of their contributions to helping young people, and the impact Wrangle Youth Club has had on the lives of many. Whilst they are no longer with us, their spirit is still very much alive in the club and their daughter, Jayne, follows in their footsteps, dedicating her time, with others, to improving the lives of young people.

Unfortunately there are now fewer dedicated Youth Services and independent Youth Clubs in Lincolnshire, but Wrangle Youth Club's continued existence is a testament to the ongoing support from individuals in the community, the club leaders, volunteers and all the members who attend each week.

The Wrangle Youth Club's 75th celebration was a fantastic opportunity to celebrate the club's success and its momentous achievement.

The Dreambelles sound tracked the evening beginning with songs dating back to when the club first opened and serenading everyone forward through time. Throughout the night, guests were able to view records and photos from previous years which added to the joyous atmosphere and allowed everyone to catch up with old friends and create new memories.

The Dreambelles managed to sum the evening up perfectly with their final song: it was 'Simply the Best'.

We also went at lunch time, And sometimes stopped fer ga-ames. Then back at three to git our stuff, Afore goin home again.

As time went on, the summer gone, And now we felt the code. Then the big co-ake sto-ave was lit, And how the fire glowed.

We soon realised, to ma-ke a prank, When tea-cher waddn't lookin, To flick some plastercine on top, And din't it stink while cooking.

Ea-ch year at harvest, as a tre-at, The Chapel decked wi produce, The tea-cher let us look inside, The wondrous site ama-zed us.

We couldn't wa-it fer Christmas time, Shop winder full of toys. I member a gre-at big box o paints, T'wood be my pride an joy.

The ticket said six shillins, I ra-ced off home from school. And counted out me pennies, Soa ple-ased I'd seventy two.

Then galloped back to git the paints, In case they'd soon be sold. But Mr. Walker's sta-atment, As good as stopped me cold.

Said six shillins and an ha-apny, Oh no! was my reply. The ticket said six shillins, Ah! Go on then, with a sigh.

He'd alust be-en a tight owd chap, His reputation known.

But I was pleased I'd got me paints, And straightway took em home.

The new classroom was ready now, We all moved back to ba-ase. We loved that time at Chapel, se-amed such a friendly pla-ace.
