A belated Happy New Year to you all and, after such a long spell of really wet conditions, I think we all deserve one. There has never been a year-end when so much land has been left unploughed, water-logged and rutted. If this is global warming perhaps we can expect a long period of good, drying weather.

Wildlife appears to have come through it OK, although there is a shortage of small birds. I have no sparrows at the farm at all now, and a reduced number of garden birds. Years ago there would always be lapwings about, on the verges and often on the grass triangles at road junctions. Only occasionally do we get them in our area now. Having said that I have, today, driven across the fen to Spilsby and discovered where they are. There are numerous patches of standing water on the black fen fields and, through my binoculars, I observed good numbers of the beautiful birds, wading around the edges and most likely feeding on worms and other invertebrates forced to the surface through lack of oxygen. Lapwings are also known as pewits, green plovers and pyewipes.

I have already heard my first song thrush trying a short song or two, as well as the odd wood pigeon practicing its summer cooing.

We have been getting several calves, some sired by the 'Angus and others by the Lincoln Red, so we have a range of colours. I enjoy watching them at play, chasing round the crewyards taking advantage of the extra room while their mothers are eating.

February was always thought to be the month for rain, indeed it used to be known as 'February fill dyke'. The seasons have changed and, in fact, I only recorded 9mm of rain in that month last year. It would really help the situation if this year's figure is something similar.

Pancake Day - 13 February

Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday, is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent – the 40 days leading up to Easter – was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Anglo-Saxon Christians went to confession and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins). A bell would be rung to call people to confession. This came to be called the "Pancake Bell" and is still rung today.

Shrove Tuesday always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday, so the date varies from year to year and falls between February 3 and March 9.

Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

The pancake has a very long history and featured in cookery books as far back as 1439. The tradition of tossing or flipping them is almost as old:

"And every man and maide doe take their turne, And tosse their Pancakes up for feare they burne." Pasquil's Palin, 1619

The ingredients for pancakes can be seen to symbolise four points of significance at this time of year:

Eggs ~ Creation Flour ~ The staff of life Salt ~ Wholesomeness Milk ~ Purity



WRANGLE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING NOTES

There was one member of the public present, they came along to ask about the cleaning of the War Memorial. Information has previously been received and will be looked at ready for celebrations in 2025

Notes of the Parish Council meeting held on 05 December 2023 attended by:

Cllrs Edwards, Featherstone, Wrisdale, Dickason, Seymour, Bowles and Ashton (Chairman).

Apologies: received from Cllr Pickett.

Also present: Borough Cllrs Butler and Baxter, County Cllr Skinner and one member of the public

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

Approve minutes of the meetings held on 03 October 2023

The notes of the Parish Council meeting, previously circulated, were approved and signed as the minutes

Receive reports from representatives on outside bodies

Borough Cllr Baxter reported on behalf of both Councillors:

Any changes to the Chapel building, and the use of the building, will require planning permission from the Borough Council. The Borough Councillors spent an evening at the Youth Club and praised the work being done there. A report of completed work on Fix my Street needs to be chased up as this is incorrect. Cabinet meetings at the Borough Council will now have a 30 minute public forum form 6.00pm. The Christmas event in Boston was very successful. An emergency meeting was held by Old Leake to discuss the situation of funding any LED replacement lights. Wrangle has received a report from the Clerk.

County Cllr Skinner reported:

A 'highways walk' has taken place to discuss a proposed site for a crossing on the A52 and to look at the state of the drains – street cleaning has been ordered following a request to the Borough Councillors. Two audits have been signed off for LCC. 500 properties across Lincolnshire were flooded in the recent heavy rain. LCC have discussed the situation regarding devolution and have agreed to go ahead with a public consultation. Public Protection are now able to carry out toxicology tests. A site has been purchased for a new fire station at Leverton.

It is crucial to keep the Emergency Parish Plan up to date. Cllr Skinner was asked why South Holland do not get consultations as the rest of Lincolnshire do, there was no answer to this.
