In the last edition I said I hoped this February's rainfall would mirror last year's 9mm. It couldn't be more disappointing, I have already recorded 57mm and it is only 11th, with more forecast! Standing water everywhere is the result of continuous rains destroying the soil structure and preventing normal percolation down to the land drains.

This evening, 12th February, I admired a clear sky with bright stars and a lovely crescent, waxing moon, which would soon be gone to bed.

Following the loss of many acres of winter sown cereals, re-drilling has begun only to be subjected to saturation once again. The result now is a serious shortage of spring cereal seed, compounding the problems facing our farmers.

One job we can get on with is hedge maintenance, and we have already begun the task of plashing (laying) 515m meters of mixed hedge. This we planted about 20 years ago and it is now quite big and strong. Indeed, some of the field maple is already 8-10 inches diameter at the base. We planted the hedge to protect an 'old Lincolnshire apple orchard' having bought the trees from Brogdale's orchard in Kent.

I have noticed that some of these trees have had their trunks 'grazed' by roe deer and muntjacs, which I do like to see around the farm but, like the badgers, I fear there will soon be too many of, neither having any natural predators.

After the warmest January the hawthorns are moving early with small, green buds already evident.

Roll on some good, dry weather.

Community Emergency Planning and

Ready for Anything Emergency Volunteer Scheme

The Wrangle Parish Council are in the process of writing a revised Parish emergency plan in partnership with the Lincolnshire County Council and the Lincolnshire Resilience Forum (LRF).

An emergency/major incident is any event or circumstance (happening with or without warning) that causes or threatens death or injury, disruption to the community, or damage to property or to the environment and the response needed is such that it is beyond the normal service provision of the council and/or emergency services.

There is no statutory responsibility for communities to plan for, respond to, or recover from emergencies, however it is sensible to be prepared in order to be in a position to cope with any emergency (under the direction of the emergency services) to limit the impact and aid recovery.

The emergency plan will be a living document and will include a structured framework for use by the community in the event of an emergency situation. This may include the prevision of warning and informing, evacuation support and the setting up and managing (temporarily) places of safety.

Members of the community can assist by notifying us of any skills they might have which they are prepared to volunteer in the event of an emergency and any equipment within the community which could be utilised to assist with the response.

For example, medically qualified, retired or existing emergency service workers, carers, veterinary, builder, carpenter, etc.

Equipment and resources such as tractors, heavy lifting gear, cutting equipment, pumps, ropes, ladders, mini buses / taxis, accommodation etc.

The plan will include vulnerable people / groups / establishments in the community to be in a position to assist these people quickly and efficiently.

Local people can volunteer to assist with the Lincolnshire Resilience Forum

The Lincolnshire Resilience Forum register and train volunteers in the 'Ready For Anything Volunteer Scheme'.

Volunteers can register to be called to assist in any emergency in Lincolnshire or just within the Old Leake and surrounding area.



WRANGLE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING NOTES

Before the start of the meeting a one minute silence was held to mark the passing of Cllr Ros Featherstone

There were two members of the public present, they came along to ask for dog bins to be sited at Greengate, Broadgate, Chapel Lane and Tooley Lane and to report the muddy footways in the village, particularly in the area of the primary school.

Notes of the Parish Council meeting held on 01 February 2024 attended by:

Cllrs Edwards, Pickett, Wrisdale, Dickason, Seymour, and Bowles (Chairman)

Apologies: received from Cllr Ashton

Also present: Borough Cllrs Butler and Baxter, County Cllr Skinner and two members of the public

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

Approve minutes of the meetings held on 05 December 2023

The notes of the Parish Council meeting, previously circulated, were approved and signed as the minutes

Receive reports from representatives on outside bodies

Borough Cllr Butler reported on behalf of both Councillors:

Cllr Baxter gave a talk to the Primary School Children about Speedway. Both of the Borough Councillors have attended events to do with flooding issues and working with other partners regarding these issues. Outer Dowsing events bring news regarding Community Gants, but there will be criteria to meet for these grants. Two new businesses have opened in Wrangle.

Wrangle Primary School will be asked if the children can make some dog fouling signs to be put up in Wrangle.

County Cllr Skinner reported:

LCC are promoting Beat the Sweet to discourage sweet eating. The Viking Way walk from the Humber through the County is available on the website. The Coroners Service for Greater Lincolnshire has merged and there is a new toxicology department. There will be a new fire station at Leverton.
