Here we are, mid-March already, and still a lot of drilling to do though seed is in very short supply. As one travels around there are numerous fields with standing water or bare patches where the crop has failed. Harvest will be well below average and straw will be in short supply.

Some are beginning to plant vegetables in less than ideal conditions. Favourable weather required now or they will struggle.

Despite all the wet, daffodils have done well and, I expect the coltsfoot will be in flower. Locally known as clay leaf their flowers, similar to the dandelion, appear before the leaves and are usually very early.

I am seeing more small birds about now. I have a few house sparrows back, mostly males but still no tree sparrows. Blue tits are investigating the nest boxes and great tits, and occasionally long tailed tits, are at the feeders with robins and dunnocks picking up what they drop. I watched a blackbird and a song thrush busily pulling ivy berries off and scoffing them. Jays are very noisy in the old wood.

Our plashing is progressing slowly, the hedge being tall and strong (see cover picture). I am seeing more brown hares again, a lovely sight, and they shouldn't be persecuted if they eat a few vegetable plants, there are plenty for all.

## Knitting up a storm for Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance

- 2. More adventurous knitters are being asked to let your imagination soar and design a unique, eye-catching postbox topper, just make sure it includes a yellow knitted helicopter!
- 3. The ultimate challenge is to yarn bomb your community and join forces with fellow knitters to create a cornucopia of colour.

LNAA's Volunteer Manager, Kate Kerrigan said: "This is a fabulous way to support the life-saving work of Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance from the comfort of your own home. With your help, we are looking to colour the counties of Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire yellow with thousands of miniature helicopters.

Dolly tub and mangle
Weshing on the line, weshed, dried an ironed
An all bi lunch time!

If flies were a nuisance, out would come the flit, Shut all the doors an windas, then giv em some on it. We all stopped outside, till the flit hed done its job, It dint take any prisners, it seeamed at git the lot. There was flies in all the windas, buzzin, spinnin on their backs, We got em in the dust pan, on the fire, that was that.

We heddn't any lectric, we used a tilley light, We hed to keeap it pumped up, to brighten up the night. Hot watter from the back boiler, tin bath on Satdy night, In front the glowing fire, we thought it was alright.

Moast werk was done bi hosses, they as seeamed so a big an strong, Wi one in front the other, they a pulled the wagon on. Sometimes we'ad here the clatter, of Frank Harrison's trottin hoss, We hed at keep well out the road, as his trolley rattled past.

Now and then we got a ride, in dad's owd Standard 10, He,ad go into the Saailor's Hoame, at last come out again. We went down to the oad seed bank, a little midda theya, He said now come an look at this, fower tiny eggs we sawa

Thease belong a scribbling lark,
Dad smilingly explained.

I thought now what a lovely name, fer summuts small as them,
Off white eggs wi the finest marks, from a little purple pen.

When Sunday came we knew the rules, we hadn't any choice,
Off we went ta Sunday school, to hear the parson's voice.
Moaast the loaacal bairns were there, theya taught us reight from wrong,
Now many kids, theya knowa the lot, it maakes a serry song.

## Community Emergency Planning and

## Ready for Anything Emergency Volunteer Scheme

The Wrangle Parish Council are in the process of writing a revised Parish emergency plan in partnership with the Lincolnshire County Council and the Lincolnshire Resilience Forum (LRF).

An emergency/major incident is any event or circumstance (happening with or without warning) that causes or threatens death or injury, disruption to the community, or damage to property or to the environment and the response needed is such that it is beyond the normal service provision of the council and/or emergency services.

There is no statutory responsibility for communities to plan for, respond to, or recover from emergencies, however it is sensible to be prepared in order to be in a position to cope with any emergency (under the direction of the emergency services) to limit the impact and aid recovery.

The emergency plan will be a living document and will include a structured framework for use by the community in the event of an emergency situation. This may include the prevision of warning and informing, evacuation support and the setting up and managing (temporarily) places of safety.

Members of the community can assist by notifying us of any skills they might have which they are prepared to volunteer in the event of an emergency and any equipment within the community which could be utilised to assist with the response.

For example, medically qualified, retired or existing emergency service workers, carers, veterinary, builder, carpenter, etc.

Equipment and resources such as tractors, heavy lifting gear, cutting equipment, pumps, ropes, ladders, mini buses / taxis, accommodation etc.

The plan will include vulnerable people / groups / establishments in the community to be in a position to assist these people quickly and efficiently.

## Local people can volunteer to assist with the Lincolnshire Resilience Forum

The Lincolnshire Resilience Forum register and train volunteers in the 'Ready For Anything Volunteer Scheme'.

Volunteers can register to be called to assist in any emergency in Lincolnshire or just within the Old Leake and surrounding area.

There were twelve members of the public present, they came along to ask about the plans received between meetings and responses from the Council; mud on the footway in the area of The Minstrels and the Remembrance Sunday service will be at Wrangle this year. The grates over the storm drains are not fitted well, or have come loose, and cause vibration in properties – County Cllr Skinner will deal with this matter.

## Approve minutes of the meetings held on 07 February 2024

The notes of the Parish Council meeting, previously circulated, were approved and signed as the minutes

## Receive reports from representatives on outside bodies

### **Borough Cllr Baxter reported:**

There have been more flooding issues, always report on Fix my Street. There have been a lot of meetings at the Borough about Council Tax, pylons and reports received via Fix my Street. A street light was removed from Chapel Lane in 2016. Volunteers are required to arrange and run events in Wrangle. Cllr Butler has cleared the footway from Sea Lane, Old Leake to Wrangle. Nominations are open for open for Boston Heroes.

## County Cllr Skinner reported:

LCC will be lifting and clearing every storm drain between Wrangle and Leverton, this is in conjunction with Cllr Butler and the Borough Council. 'Nearly flooding' issues also need to be reported on Fix my Street too. 800 properties across Lincolnshire have been flooded with an further 650 nearly flooded. The LCC budget has put more into flooding as four suction vehicles have been purchased with four extra exploratory teams employed. Last year 110,000 pot holes were filled, 224 miles of roadway and 77 miles of footway were cleaned and 192,235 drains were repaired. An extra £25m will be received from the Government for Highways next year.

## **Community Speed Watch**

Old Leake Parish Council is prepared to work with Wrangle on this scheme and an extra two volunteers have already come forward. Hopefully there will be more volunteers by the end of March.
