The year marches on and now, in the middle of May, the trees are looking at their best, with their bright green foliage. After all the wet we have now enjoyed a very warm, dry period and some of the land, particularly the heavier soils, are ready for a rain to soften the clods and keep the late-sown cereals moving.

There's an old saying 'if the oak be out before the ash we're only in for a splash' but 'if the ash be out before the oak, then we'll get a good soak'. Well, the oak trees are approaching full leaf whilst many ash leaves are only just beginning to unfurl. This should not be confused with ash die-back (*chalara fraxinia*) which is obvious by the top, dead branches readily seen standing out bare. Some experts forecast up to 95% loss of our ash trees. This will be a sad situation after losing nearly all the elms due to Dutch elm disease.

Our woodlands are mixed, thank goodness, so the impact will not be so obvious. My first swallow appeared on the 17th April and the cuckoo and house martins last Saturday 11th May. We are overwhelmed with grass and I am struggling to find some replacement cattle to help keep on top of it. These must be organic and also from a TB4 area. Much of the country is under restriction.

Many hundreds of acres of veg. land is now under polythene or bird net, something never seen years ago. Our farm was the first in the county to use polythene cover, on early potatoes. This gave us a three week advantage over the competition, enjoyed for a few years. It's amazing how nature adapts and wood pigeons and pheasants have soon learned how to peck small plants through the little holes in the polythene crop cover. They also get used to gas guns and come to see what's there to eat.

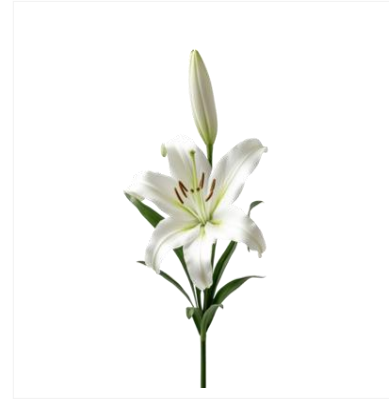

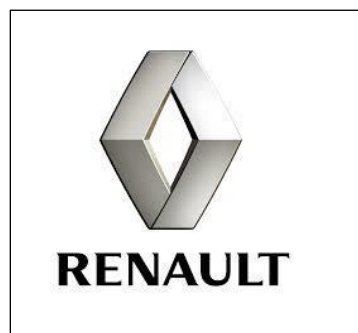

Chairman's Annual Report to Parishioners

‘In the twelve months since colleagues did me the immense honour of electing me Chairman of the Parish Council time genuinely has seemed to fly by - it does only seem like yesterday that we were conducting our 2023 APM.

It has been a year tinged with immense sadness. We saw the closure of the Wrangle Methodist Chapel, the final service for which I attended in November, bringing to an end the public life of a building which has stood tall and proud in our village since 1843. I continue to be immensely disappointed that, despite approaches from the Parish Council with a view to preserving the building for community use, the Methodist Church is resolved to sell it in order ‘to invest in the flourishing of Christian faith and community service elsewhere’. The closure service was immensely moving, bringing together past and present members of the congregation for one final time in a building which was clearly a huge part of the lives of many local people.

Further, we were all deeply saddened by the passing of our long-serving and immensely valued colleague Councillor Ros Featherstone in January, at the time the second-longest serving member of the Parish Council and very much a part of the fabric of our village who will continue to be much missed by all.

The last year has, however, seen us welcome new faces too, with two new Parish Councillors joining us in May 2023, and over the past year they have made valued contributions to the work of the Council. Likewise we also saw two new Borough Councillors elected and we are grateful for their presence and reports at our meetings tackling perennially challenging issues of planning, streetlights, and other issues. Also it has been good to see our County Councillor - Paul Skinner - regularly at our meetings picking up on Highways issues, footpaths, and flooding issues among other things. I am hopeful that he will have success in getting us a pedestrian crossing in the village through the efforts he is making on our behalf.

Last winter saw an unprecedented amount of rainfall in Lincolnshire, and the experiences of other parts of the County serve as a constant reminder of the perils of flooding and the need for well-maintained drainage channels to get water away quickly. The Witham 4th IDB deserves particular praise for how well its system coped, even during the worst of Storms Babet and Henk, and the water in the drains in Wrangle would have gone down even

would have gone down even quicker had they not had to pump for five days just to get rid of the water which ran out of the poorly maintained Environment Agency systems running through the Stickford and Stickney Fen area. Ed Johnson, the Chief Engineer for the Witham Fourth IDB took the time to visit the Parish Council, updating on the work of the Board and on progress with the new Wrangle Pumping Station which is due to be completed and operational this summer.

Despite these difficulties, it is good to see so many of our local organisations and activities continuing successfully. We all owe a debt of gratitude to everyone who volunteers in keeping each of the aspects of life in our village going and our community that much more vibrant as a consequence - the Village Hall, the Wrangle Show, the Church, the Youth Club, the Parish Magazine to name but a small number.

Finally a word of particular thanks to Parish Council colleagues for your support over the last year - especially my Vice Chairman Bryan for looking after the couple of meetings I have been unable to attend, and our Clerk, Teddy, for ensuring that everything runs efficiently.”

County Cllr Skinner - sent a emailed report which was read out by the Clerk

Borough Cllr Baxter thanked everyone for making the new Borough Councillors very welcome and for the help they are getting whilst learning the new roles. They are helping out with events in the village and are supporting a new venture in the Village Hall. Fix my Street continues to be monitored and seems to be working well. An email containing a more detailed report will be sent to all Councillors.

Wrangle Consolidated Charities - accounts

The Consolidated Charities accounts have been received, they were outlined by the Clerk. Income is received from allotment rents and property rent. Grants are given to University students and for apprenticeships. Cllr Bowles reported that there are very few applications being received for grants each year (applications are welcome in October/November each year).

Alenson & Erskine Foundation - accounts

The accounts for the Alenson & Erskine Charity were outlined out by the Clerk. Income is received from weekly maintenance allowance received for the almshouses and from allotment rents. All the funds for the educational side of the charity is given to students in the form of grants.

Correspondence

An email has been received regarding a children playing sign for Mel Marshall Way and asking that the nameplate be lowered due to blocking the visibility when exiting onto the Main Road. This will be requested from the relevant authorities.

A 30mph sign has been damaged, can it be replaced? This will be on the agenda for the next meeting.

Highways:

A pot hole at Hall End Road will be reported on Fix my Street. The public footpath off Hall lane needs to be cut. It was reported that street lights on poles will not be changed to LED, this will be checked.

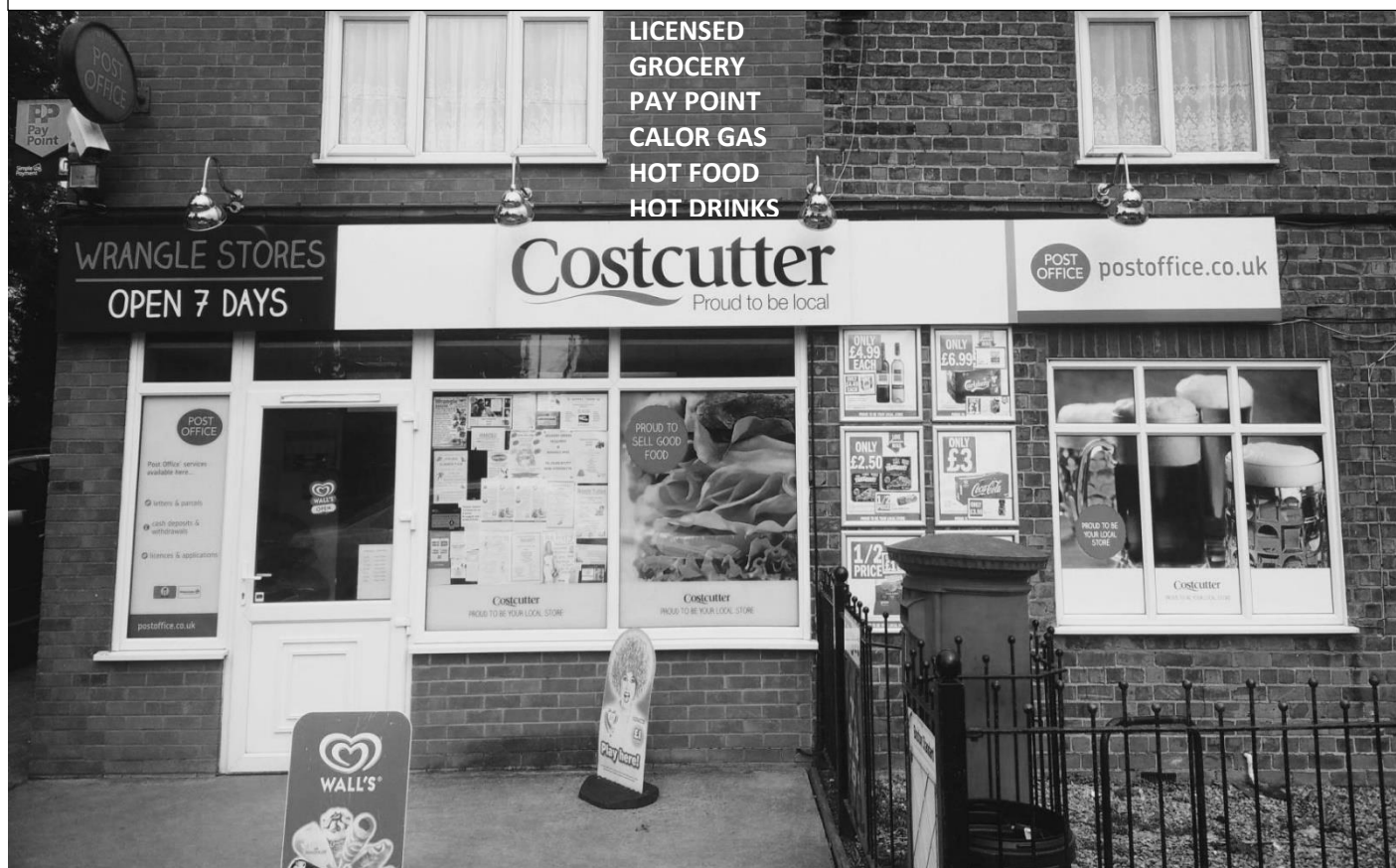
