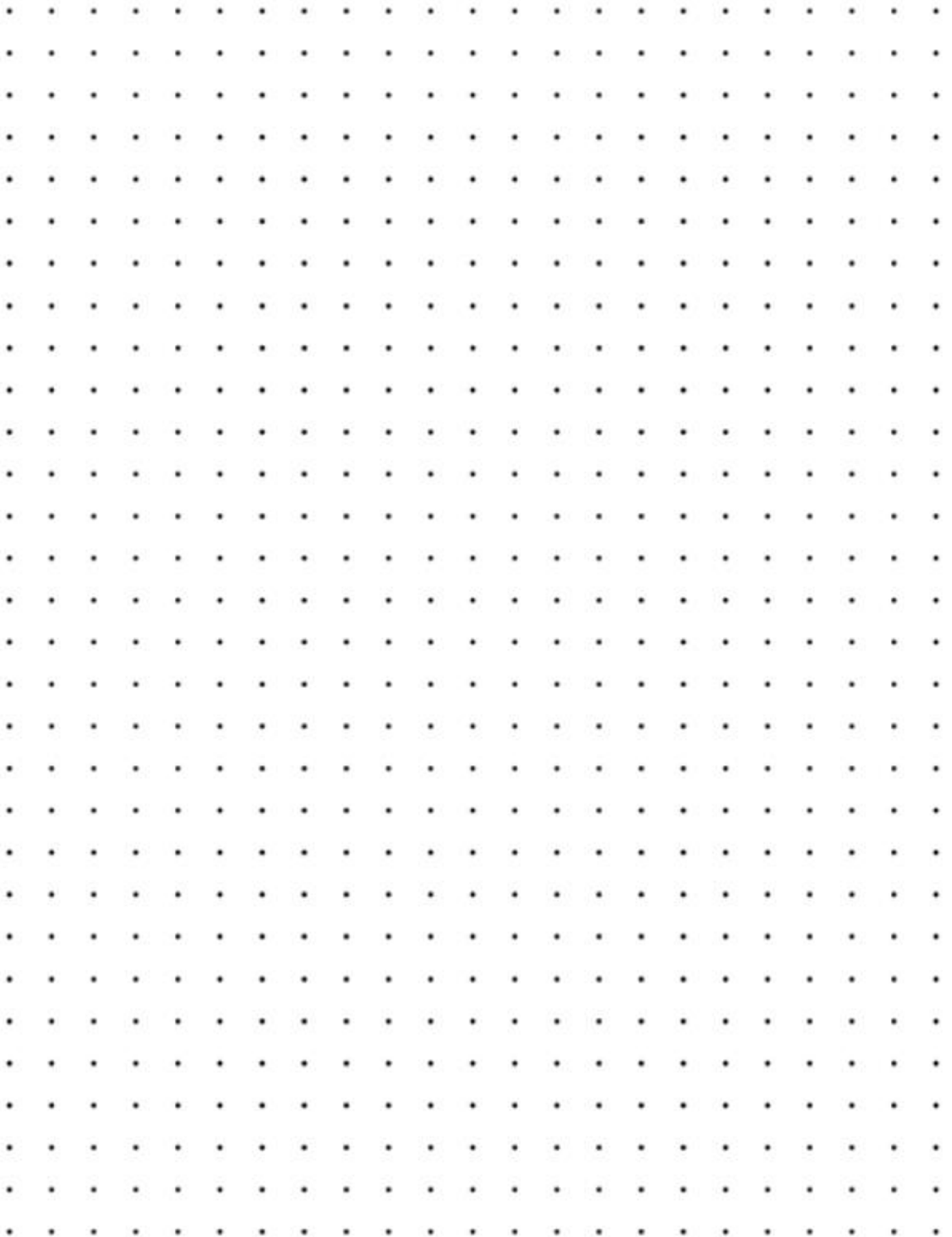

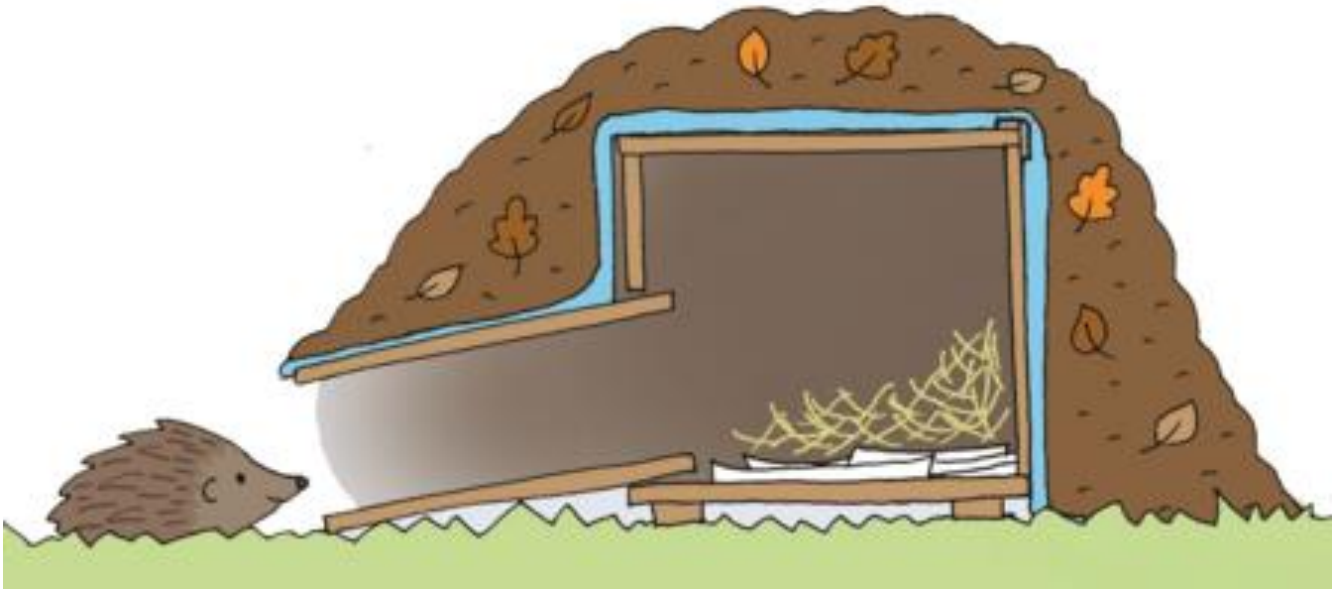

By providing safe places for hedgehogs to live, you're much more likely to see these prickly creatures in your garden.



Sadly the number of hedgehogs in the UK has plummeted over recent years. While there were estimated to be around 1.5 million in 1995, today there is believed to be less than 500,000.

Hedgehogs need homes just like humans, so making one for them is a great way to encourage them into your garden. Hedgehogs are becoming increasingly reliant on urban and suburban gardens. Urban populations of hedgehogs have increased by up to a third, while rural populations have halved. This decline is likely caused by the loss and degradation of our habitats due to pressures such as development, agricultural intensification and climate change.

So, whether you live in town or country, you can help to look after garden wildlife like hedgehogs by providing food, water and shelter. The cross section above give an idea of what you could do for hedgehogs..

Pick a shady, quiet spot to put your hedgehog house. Lift the lid off the house, and put the dry leaves inside.

Cover the lid with polythene sheeting (making sure it's still accessible for cleaning later on), and pack soil and dead leaves around the outside, leaving the entrance free of debris.

Clear out the hedgehog house once a year (late March to early April) to prevent the build-up of pests. Do not clean it out if a hedgehog is in residence though!

Making a log pile or compost heap are also good options for providing space for hedgehogs to nest, and have the added bonus of attracting lots of insects for them to eat!

Now the 'smith he was a crackin chap, was honest, straight and true. Ama-azing craftsmanship at his job, and a chapel pre-acher too. His na-ame was Rupert Spikings, and fo-akes soon larned his wayas. If any eused bad language they's git nowt done that daya.

He'd sarved a goos apprenticeship at Sibsey, not far awa-ay, under Mr Parker who's wok's still about todaya. He eused to sasya to shaft a tool, a slasher, ferk er spa-ade, should look like it hed gr-oan in there, when a perfect job was ma-ade.

I offten took some jobs to Rupert, I loved to watch him werk. He realized I was interested, and took it as a perl. The man hed soa much knowledge, he was alwayas ke-an to share, sometimes we'd discuss the options to git the best repair.

He was an expert welder and wanted me to see, soa found an extra safety shield and passed it 'cross to me. He'd expla-ain what he was doin, he wanted me to knowa. Alust I'd learn summuts ea-ach time I hed to goa.

His fa-vrit metal, IRON, the one that ne-ads moa-ast skill. He'd lay and sharpen 'arras – and knock em out at will. And when all were re-assembled – he'd gev em plenty owd – they'd make the little Fergy scrat, to pull em any ro-ad.

I've learned a lot from Rupert; was lucky that's fer sure. An expert and a gentleman remembered ever more.

I'll be forever grateful, for all advice he gave. A blacksmith and a masterpiece, with an anvil on his grave.

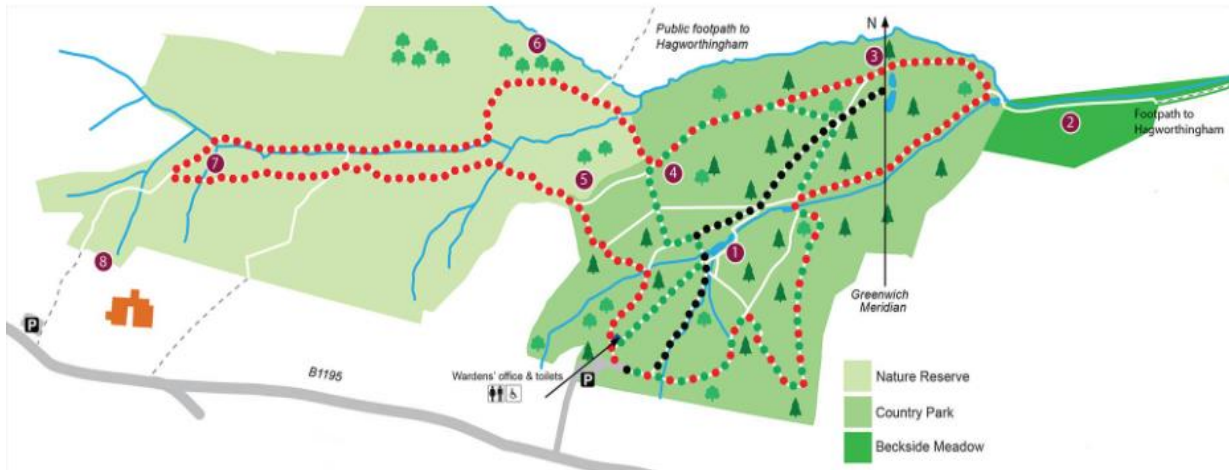

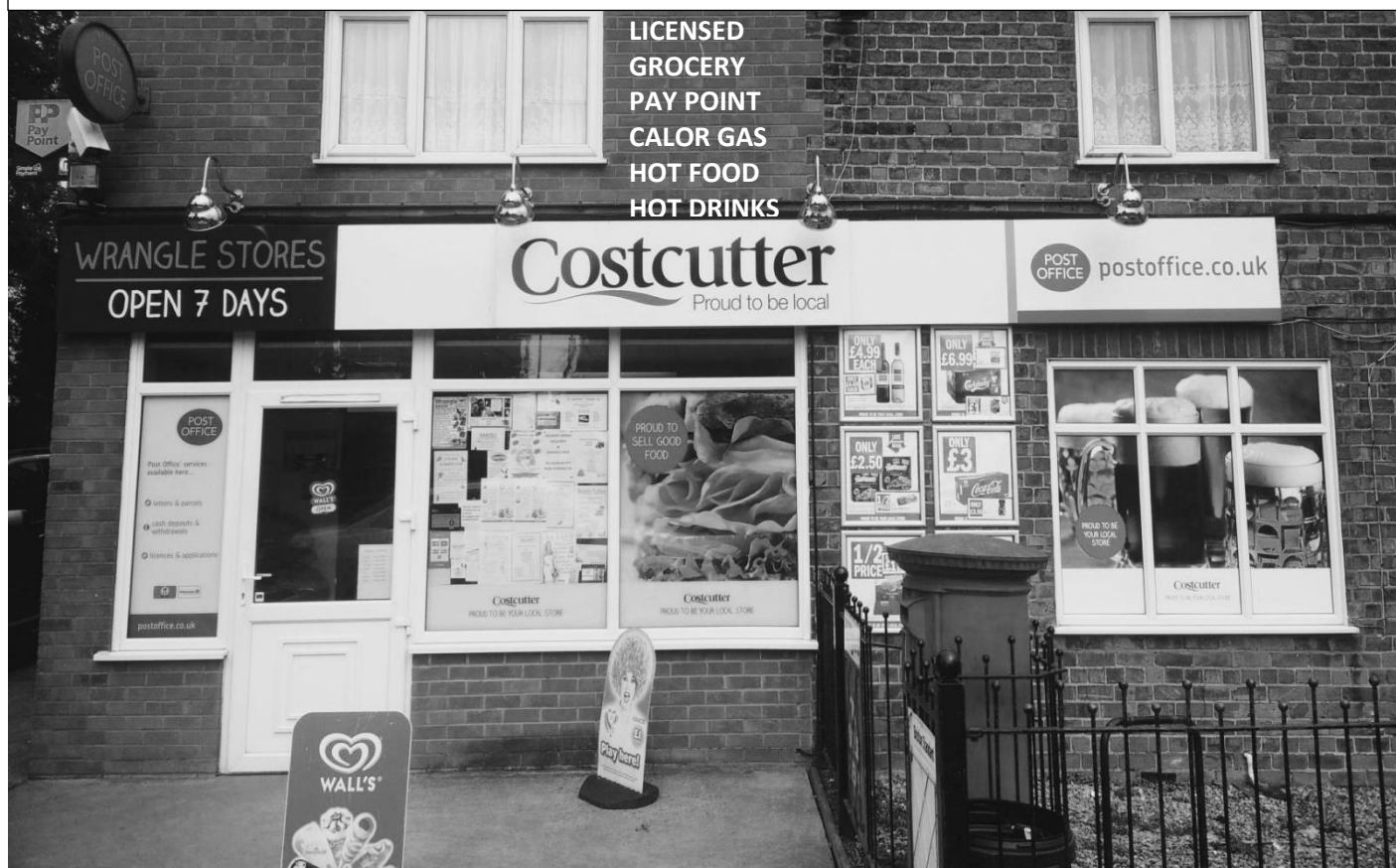
