It's so good to be back on home ground, and slowly returning to a more normal routine. The unsettled weather finally relented and allowed most farms to get the harvest in reasonable condition. Yields were, of course, often lower as was expected following a difficult sowing season.

There's a shortage of small birds, the exception being some good flocks of gold finches. We also have several tree sparrows at the Sailor's Home. Butterflies have been in short supply this time with fewer of the coloured ones, though we have plenty of large whites producing caterpillars for the brassicas. One welcome species that has made an appearance this year is the attractive clouded yellow. Their food plant is white clover and that is plentiful in the grass fields. These only get here when conditions are favourable for them to cross the Cannel. They are quite large and a beautiful lemon colour, not as rich as the brimstone we see earlier in the year.

We have plenty of dragonflies, of all colours and sizes. On Wednesday morning (11/9) we had a cold north-west wind but, as I checked the young cattle in the church grass field which has excellent shade, it was a real pleasure to stand and watch as 20 - 30 swallows and house martins swooped back and forth beside the trees, feeding up on the flies that were attracted by the warmth and shelter. There were also two juvenile yellow wagtails darting about catching insects in the short grass. Their underparts were only slightly yellow and not the vivid colour they will be in the spring.

What could be better than witnessing nature at its best in Wrangle?

Over the weekend of 07 and 08 September our Church of St Mary & St Nicholas opened it's doors as part of the Heritage Open Days.



Bonfire Guide

In order to avoid problems and possible legal action, it is recommended that you follow the checklist below.-

- > Only burn dry material.
- > Never burn household rubbish, rubber tyres, or anything containing plastic, foam or paint.
- > Never use old engine oil, methylated spirits or petrol to light a bonfire or to 'encourage it'.
- Avoid lighting a fire in unsuitable weather conditions smoke hangs in the air on damp, still days and in the evening.
- Avoid burning if the wind will take any smoke into neighbours gardens/houses and across roads.
- > Avoid burning at weekends and on bank holidays when people want to enjoy their gardens.
- > Never leave a fire unattended or leave it to smoulder.

Bonfires can be dangerous. Fire can spread to fences or buildings and scorch trees and plants.

Exploding bottles and cans are a hazard when rubbish is burned.

The Fire and Rescue Service will deal with bonfires if there is a risk to the safety of people or buildings.

UPGRADE YOUR HEATING AND REDUCE YOUR CARBON FOOTPRINT

South and East Lincolnshire Councils Partnership have secured Homes Upgrade Grant funding (HUG 2) from the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ) to

assist homeowners and landlords in making improvements to the energy efficiency of their properties while reducing utility costs.

HUG 2 will focus only on off gas properties however there may be other funding available for those who do not meet the criteria so please get in touch if you are unsure. To be eligible for the grant, your property must have an Energy Performance Rating of D, E, F or G and a total household income of less than £36k of which Personal Independence Payment (PIP), Disability Living Allowance (DLA) and Attendance Allowance (AA) will be deducted if you are in receipt of these.

The Home Energy Advice and Retrofit Team would be delighted to hear from homeowners and landlords that would like to take advantage of a grant which is available to improve the energy efficiency of your home and move to low carbon heating upgrades. The grants available will be between £8,000 and £38,000 per home depending on the properties wall type, Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating and current fuel type.

The scheme will target low carbon heating such as air source heat pumps as well as energy efficiency measures which will help boost your EPC rating. Grant funding is limited so please don't delay contacting us.



- We have attended, and continue to engage with the Parish Council on local issues and feel we have a good working relationship with them.

There were two members of the public present, they came along to report the poor water pressure in the village (County Cllr Skinner will look into this issue), enquire about the letter sent to 5G (asking if they still want a site in Wrangle and can the Parish Council suggest a site) and to ask about a development off Tooley Lane (now not the same as first impressions given).

Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

Approve minutes of the meetings held on 02 July 2024

The notes of the Parish Council meeting, previously circulated, were approved and signed as the minutes

<u>Receive reports from representatives on outside bodies</u> Borough Cllr Butler reported:

A report has been sent to the Clerk for circulation to all Councillors, this includes the grass cutting at the Chapel. Following discussion it was resolved that questions would be asked about the maintenance of the grass and the Parish Council would look at the situation once further information has been received. Issues bought to the attention of the Borough Councillors have been passed to the relevant authority to action. The next Wyberton Womble Big Borough Clean Up will be on Sunday 27 October.

County Cllr Skinner reported:

LCC will be submitting a planning application for a new fire station at Leverton. There will be a consultation on 25 September. The manhole covers on the A52 are on a program to be levelled. A traffic management plan has been approved for the area around the Giles Academy. There have been two repair visits to Wrangle.

Community Speed Watch

Cllr Dickason has had problems getting the volunteers to commit to a date for training. It was suggested that this be put back until the Spring when hopefully more volunteers will come forward. An Archer report from Staying Alive Lincolnshire has been received and circulated to all Councillors. The results show that data received does not meet criteria for further speed camera enforcement.

Siting Dog/Litter Bins at Tooley Lane and Main Road bus stop opposite Tooley Lane

Litter/dog bins should be placed at the Chapel and by the bus shelter opposite Tooley Lane, these will be ordered from the Borough Council at a cost of £705.00 + VAT

Siting two bus shelters on the A52 in the area of the Sea Lane junction

The land owner will be asked about the base for one of the shelters. The licence to site the bus shelters has been received from LCC. Grants will be sought for the bus shelters. Details of one grant has been received.

War Memorial works to be carried out

The War Memorial will be cleaned at the end of September.

Recreation field

A list of repairs to be carried out has been made from the annual inspection report, these will be arranged in due course. A cleaning up day will be organised after the repairs have been carried out – volunteers can help out on the day when it is arranged. An offer to have two inspection per year for five years has been approved by the Parish Council. Moles are still an issue, a contractor has cleared the recreation field for the grass cutting to continue. The door on the notice board has been smashed, it was resolved to get a quote for polycarbonate to be placed in the door instead of toughened glass. The goal posts have been damaged and are currently being repaired. A picnic table has been removed from the play area and damaged, this is currently being repaired and will be re-sited in the play area. A 'no parking' sign will be purchased for the gates at the rear of the pavilion.

A letter has been received from LCC stating that the footfall at Main Road does not the criteria for a zebra crossing: "During the period 8am – 6pm (22.07.24) only 36 pedestrians crossed the road at this point, of which 10 where children and the resultant score was 0.09. Given that a score of 0.5 will be required for a pedestrian refuge, and higher for a Zebra or Puffin facility, I regret that the criteria for a crossing facility are not met at this location at this time and I will therefore have to refuse this request. I am sorry that I cannot be of further assistance in this matter."

Cllrs Dickason and Law have done all they can on the Emergency Parish Plan, more input is required from others with local knowledge. An evening with a talk from the team in Lincoln will be considered. Other Emergency Plans in the village will be sought.
