

Happy New Year and, we all hope, a better one. 2024 has been challenging to say the least. A poor harvest, after the awful conditions at sowing time, then the drought in early summer followed by catchy weather to get the crops in.

Despite the above it's a sobering thought when we consider the outrageous events abroad. Unheard of floods, storms and hurricanes and the devastating wild fires in western America. Again a catalogue of extremes taking many lives and leaving thousands without a home. We really should be very satisfied with our little country, and the comfortable lives we mostly enjoy.

Now, for a welcome change, we have just experienced a spell of proper winter weather - the way things used to be years ago. In those days the land was often frozen solid for quite a time, and the benefits to spring cultivations were something now almost forgotten. If we are lucky, and don't get another deluge of heavy rain, the soil will be left in good form for spring.

Brother John had a session skating on a flooded part of our wetlands recently – something we used to do a lot years ago. The fact that he still holds the record for the Lincolnshire Mile, won so long ago, shows how times have changed. There hasn't been suitable ice in the county since.

The sharp spell has finally brought more birds to my feeders. I have been watching the usual tits, finches, robins and dunnocks with plenty of blackbirds, some fieldfares and a pair of beautifully marked mistle thrushes. I was especially pleased to see a green sandpiper feeding in a deep ditch that had remained ice-free. This attractive wading bird, very rare in this area, has a distinctive white back and rump that is so noticeable in flight.

When yar look at the wayas the jobs hev changed, From what it was years agoa, We're fast becoming a naation of wimps, Noa will to lay 'ode, like before.

The corn sacks were enormous, and were filled up to the top. They onny held 12 ston of o-ats, but barley 16 we got. Of whe-at with 18 sto-ans they were full, and that was enough it would se-am. But last of all yar'd git 19 sto-ans, when threshing pe-as or Be-ans.

> Well two of these sacks were a quaarter, And that's how we measured the yield. It was soa many quaarters the aacre, From any particular field.

Course, all of thease hed to be shifted, And noa ferk lifts hed we then. Yar hed to just collar the beggars, And manage to moave em yersen.

Wi boath hands grabb in the lugs, And yer kneas stuck into the seeam, Yar could leean back an ton yersen sidewayas, Fer to git on the weighin machi-an.

Now that was onny the fost bit, They'd got to be put on the cart. There was three different wayas to do it, Let's look at the barra to start.

A sack barra's not what it sounds like, Noa wheels that'll tek mo-ast the weight. It's just a flat board wi two handles, eaach end, And the sack hes to stand up quite straigh-at.

Two fellas git ode o' the handles, And ea-ach sticks their he-ad in the sack, Soa it hodes it upreight as theya lift it, To be ta-aken on somebody's back.

A hickin stick is the next option, It's onny a shaft ma-ade of wood. Two blo-akes pull the sack back ageinst it, If it balances then that is good.

At last there ca-ame an invention, A windin barra's what it was called. Yar could wind the sack up to just the reight height, Noa matter how short or how tall.

If the ground was hard and level, Or inside a shed wi a floor, A runnin barra was best waya to shift em, Noa sweat then, er shouders soa sore. Just think of the miller, what he hed to do, To git the whe-at reight to the top. Some o the mills hed up to six floors, He'd to carry the sacks through the lot.

All of the floors hed a trapdoor, And a ladder that went up to e-ach. As the miller climbed up the sack pushed its waya through, Then he kicked the door back wi his fe-at.

Now all thease ode wayas are a thing o the past, Nearly all the hard werk hes gone. Why, the young uns todaya theya do-ant knowa they're born, And mo-ast on em aren't very strong.

The rules, theya ke-ap changing, ivory few years, Yar should hardly pick owt up at all. Just fower ston of taates is all that's allowed, And not eaven that off the floor.

Drams an ounces, pounds an sto-ans, hundred weights, quaarters an tons, We're all metric now, in measures as well, How boaring when all sed and done.



Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 3rd December 2024

There were no members of the public present.

<u>Apologies</u>: Apologies were accepted from Cllr Hill, Pickett and Borough Cllr Butler. <u>Present</u>: Cllrs Ashton (Chairman), Dickason, Bowles, Edwards, Law, Seymour and Wrisdale. <u>Also present</u>: County Cllr Skinner and Borough Cllr Baxter.

Declarations of interest

There were no declarations of interest.

Approve minutes of the meeting held 05 November 2024

It was resolved that the minutes previously circulated be signed as the minutes.

To receive reports from representatives on outside bodies:

Borough Cllr Baxter Reported:

Farmers were contacted regarding mud on the road, road sweeping has been arranged. This can be reported on fix my street if necessary. Concern around young people cycling in the dark with no lights. Communication with County Cllr and Borough Council, advertising and communication coming out shortly. Boston Borough Council leader to contact Brylaine and Stagecoach with regards to the bus service to the village centre.

County Councillor Skinner reported:

The formation of the Greater Lincolnshire Combined County Authority has been approved by the new government. For details on timetables bus services over Christmas and New Year visit: www.lincsbus.info/christmas

Approve the draft budget for the year ended 31 March 2026 and set the precept:

It was proposed, seconded and voted that a Civic Budget of £500.00 would be added to the Budget. It was agreed that the LALC Subscription budget be increased to £500.00 and renamed Training and Development. It was moved, seconded and voted to set the Precept at £48000.00

Update on the siting of two bus shelters on the A52 in the area of Sea Lane junction.

A local business has agreed to supply two bases for each of the bus shelters. It was discussed that the landowner for one of the sites would need to be contacted as would a nearby house. Thanks was expressed by all to the local business.

To receive update regarding Interactive Speed Sign

Quotes had been received to upgrade the current Speed Sign and to utilise the current Speed Sign elsewhere. A meeting is to be arranged in the New Year with Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership to discuss further. An email had been received from a Community Speed Watch Co-Ordinator advising that Wrangle do not have a group of volunteers to undertake roadside checks. It was discussed that there was a lack of volunteers to be able to get a group running. It was agreed to wait until Spring and relaunch.

Update regarding the 5G mast

No update on this, currently awaiting a response from Richard Tice.
