Well, that's another year gone and, many will say, good riddance! We're all hoping for some sustained dry weather now. I've not heard anyone say they have known a 'back end' as wet as that. Many veg. fields are in a terrible, rutted state and it will take some time for them to recover. Hardly any winter wheat has been sown and a lot of land remains unploughed.

We brought the cattle in early, because of the wet, and the straw bedding is of poor quality owing to the catchy harvest. It doesn't last very long and stocks are already running down.

The wildfowl, on the other hand, seem quite happy with the conditions. Mallard, teal, wigeon and gadwalls accompanied by grey lag and Canada geese regularly use our wetlands. Herons, little egrets, curlew and snipe, with the occasional woodcock, are also attracted by the ideal habitat.

A few woodpigeons have already started their familiar 'summer' calling which we all recognise. Our tractor driver, Mark, thinks they are saying "my feet hurt Peter" but I am not convinced.

We've all seen how the seasons are changing and weather extremes are becoming the norm. Perhaps all the rain is just another example but we shall, no doubt, get over it. It is still far better than the situation in Australia and we must spare a thought for those poor folk who have lost relatives, homes and animals.

Approve Minutes of the meeting held on 05 November 2019

Notes of the meeting, previously circulated, were approved and signed as the minutes.

To receive reports from representatives on outside bodies

The PCSO reported by email, incidents to 30 November:

1 transport hazards at Wrangle Bank; 1 traffic offence at Brick Lane; 2 incidents of fraud/forgery at Brick Lane; 2 concern for safety at Sea Lane and at Bull Drove and 1 suspicious circumstance at Church Close

Borough Councillor Pickett had nothing to report

Borough Councillor Ashton reported:

Funding of around £25m is available for the regeneration of towns. He had attended a meeting to talk about controlling river levels and various possible ways to help prevent flooding. The Borough Council cannot make any decisions at the present time due to purdah.

Councillors report

Councillors Danby and Seymour attended a meeting at the Borough Council where:

The Police & Crime Commissioner reported that there has been a lot of lead thefts across the County and the Police are working with other authorities to catch the thieves. Information from the meeting has been emailed to Councillors, the slide from the presentation are available on the Parish Council website.

The Borough Council reported that the cost for the use of brown bins will increase to £45.00 for the first bin. The purple bins, being experimented in some areas of Boston, are proving successful due to the cardboard and paper not being contaminated from other items in the recycling bin. The Borough Council employ two Environment Enforcement Officers who issue fixed penalty notices for littering (including cigarette ends), spitting, fly tipping etc. There have been 280 Fixed Penalty Notices issued between 01 September and 28 November. The costs of a by-election for a Parish Council has been questioned, a breakdown of the costs will be issued.

<u>Highways</u>

No itinerary was received for the highways trip around the village, the Chairman did wait at the meeting point, but no-one turned up. Grass verges in the village are now mud due to the very wet conditions. The vibration test has not been carried out at the properties at Main Road

General Maintenance

It was agreed that there were two arms, one for Wrangle Common and one for Wrangle Village with a dome reading Holland County Council on the top. LCC have reported that the metal around the field between Edina and Church End junction is not it's property. Following discussion it was resolved to get some quotations for the fence to be straightened.


