After many years of escape, whilst a number of churches in the area have been targeted, we have now fallen victim to lead thieves. Early on 19 October most of the lead was taken from the north aisle, and the criminals returned early on 21 October and stripped about 40% of that on the south aisle. Fortunately they were disturbed and had to abandon the lead they had thrown down.

Volunteers worked all that day to cover the affected areas with waterproof sheeting, in an attempt to keep the church dry. This has only been partially successful, and in the current wet and windy conditions, there are several places where water is still getting in. Replacing the roof covering is a very expensive exercise and, being a listed building, there are so many regulations and restrictions. The PCC now has to find ways of acquiring the many thousands of pounds needed to cover the cost, any ideas would be very welcome. A collecting box has been placed in our local Wrangle Stores in case you want to help out.

My thanks to all those who give time and effort to keep the church and surrounds in such a tidy condition.

On a more cheerful note, the large number of pinkfeet geese I mentioned last month have, I discovered, been feeding on maize stubble on Greenfield Farm. The crop, harvested late for the digester owing to the wet conditions, had shed many cobs and these made a real banquet for the geese, which were accompanied by around 30 swans. No doubt a recent, welcome addition to the wildfowl diet.

Hopefully things will dry up before long but, for now, may I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Five ways to 'get the best out of Christmas'

That time is nearly upon us, and it'll creep up quickly. Here are five suggestions for making the best of our celebration of the birth of Jesus.

1. Look forward

It is so easy to see the very important concerns about food, cards, presents and parties overshadow the *most* important. Could you deliberately build in some time each day or each week during Advent to stop, calm yourself, and refocus? *A Strange Christmas* by Krish Kandiah is a great little book to help us prepare.

2. Look around

No doubt there will be some extra church activities going on over Christmas, but did you know that research has shown that 20% of people in Britain would be grateful for an opportunity to think about who Jesus is? We have so often believed the lie that no-one is interested in our faith. So, seek the seekers, and invite them to something. Who do you know who is likely to be keen to find out more?

3. Look outwards

Deuteronomy 26 contains the instructions for celebrating the Jewish Harvest Festival, but built into the chapter are encouragements to remember the foreigners, widows and orphans in the land in their celebrations. Is there anyone you might include in your festivities, who might otherwise go without?

4. Look again

Part of Christmas is the repetition of readings, prayers and carols that we have been using since 'the year dot'. Could you address the familiarisation by choosing to think more deeply about the words we're using? Ask the Holy Spirit to give you one new insight into the Christmas story this year, or take maybe just one line from a carol and let it dwell in your thoughts and prayers.

5. Look up

When all the presents are wrapped and the sprouts peeled, take some time to reconnect with the wonder of it all, which can so easily get lost among the mundane. The God of the Universe, the King of Kings and Lord above all Lords stepped down into our world in the shape of a newborn baby so that we might know God and share the eternity of heaven, feasting at his table! Wow! What a tragedy if we miss that!

From the desk of your Vicar...

My father used to tell of one of his earliest memories – as a young boy being carried down the stairs of his Leicester home on Christmas morning and seeing the Christmas Tree all trimmed up. The night before all had been ordinary - Christmas exploded on his world on Christmas morning! What joy and delight that brought. I hope that stirs some memories because that is how things used to be ... Christmas arrived late on Christmas Eve and lasted for the twelve days of Christmas, these finish and on their heels is the Feast of the Epiphany on the 6th January, celebrating the visit of the Wise Men from the East to the young child – Jesus. When Christmas began at Christmas we did not get fed up of the festive season before it had even begun!

It is a sad but certain fact that the relentless commercialisation of Christmas has meant that shops carry the Christmas goods ever earlier as they encourage a frenzy of spending and over consumption that does not really reflect the Christmas message. I am not over fond of the 'trick or treat' element of Halloween but at least it serves to occupy the supermarket shelves and stops Christmas being on full display before November. I can sympathise with the faithful Christians who find it really hard to face Christmas joyfully within the clamour of commercialised Christmas. So often Christ is crossed out – replaced with an X.

BUT we must reclaim Christmas for Christ – it is his birth we are celebrating. People who want nothing to do with church year round give us this window of opportunity to Celebrate Christ, Christmas is his festival.

So let us keep the feast! Come and join us to hear the Christmas message at Christmas celebrations at St Mary & St Nicholas, Wrangle:
