Now, at mid-September, the swallows are gathered into flocks ready for their long migration back to Africa. Flies are fewer and they are swooping back and forth, in the shade of trees and hedges and feeding up for the journey.

Yellow wagtails, which are on the endangered list, seem more numerous this year. They feed on insects disturbed by the cattle as they graze. The little birds dart about among the hooves snapping them up. They are usually in families of 8 - 10 birds.

The Community Orchard has its most productive year with several trees laden with fruit. Pears have done pretty well, and some apples too, although there are still many trees without fruit, especially plums.

PLEASE HELP YOURSELVES!!

After a catchy start harvest has now been gathered in quite quickly, and autumn cultivations are underway.

The hedgerows are laden with berries, fruits and nuts awaiting the arrival of the winter thrushes, fieldfares, redwings and 'European' blackbirds. Many of our resident blackbirds move west to Wales and Ireland for winter.

Before long the cattle will be in and the seven-day job will take us through to next April. Happy days!

From the desk of your Vicar...

Simplistically stated: years ago when someone died they usually died at home or in the fields; the women of the village would deal with laying out the body and the friends and family of the loved one departed would take them, in a coffin made by the local carpenter, to the parish church where there would be a graveside service and burial. Death happened in the midst of life, everyone young and old knew that it happened and, of course, there were many more young deaths with higher infant mortality, and deaths from influenza small pox and so on – some illnesses taking whole families or decimating them. My point is that death was not hidden and secret but faced full on.

In contrast today death is hardly talked about, as though by speaking of it I invite it in! More and more often death is not at home but in a hospice or behind hospital curtains, we buy in professionals to take care of the body and again, often, the service to say goodbye is not in the middle of the village but in that curious place reserved for death – the crematorium. My point is that death is hidden away and even talk of it avoided!

One disastrous result of this social change is that we expect the bereaved to 'get over it' and folk don't know how to talk to people who have lost someone, so they cross the road...

As Christians we believe that Christ beat the last enemy – death – but we do not deny how hard it is to lose our loved ones. As churchgoers we know that loss lasts and lasts and that grief can rush back into the fullest of focus in alarming ways.

Each Autumn we provide a special service where we can particularly recall loved ones lost, where their names can be spoken, where we have space to be quiet and where no one will say – 'Aren't you over that?' This year our **Service of Thanksgiving and Memory at St Mary & St Nicholas, Wrangle is on Wednesday 30th October at 7pm.**

Please come along and join us if you feel it may be of help to you and please mention it to others who may find it of comfort.

When do the clocks change next?

Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) resumes from the last Sunday in October (October 27) when the clocks go back one hour.

To avoid confusion, many use the phrase "spring forward in spring, fall back in fall" to remember when the clocks go backwards and forwards.

When the clocks go back we all enjoy an extra hour in bed.

What is British Summer Time (BST) and why is it used?

Daylight Saving Time was created by William Willett in 1907 in a bid to stop people wasting valuable hours of light in the summer months.

By setting the clocks back in winter, Brits get an earlier sunrise and earlier sunset.

In summer the sun rises and sets one hour later than it would without daylight saving.

In a pamphlet called "The Waste of Daylight" Willett suggested clocks should be advanced by 80 minutes over four stages in April and reversed the same way in September.

Germany became the first country to adopt the clock-changing plan on 30 April 1916, in order to save on coal usage, and on 21 May Britain followed, as World War One was underway.

The Summer Time Act of 1916 was passed by Parliament and the first day of British summer was reported as 21 May 1916.

Supporters at the time of the proposal argued the scheme would save energy by reducing domestic coal consumption. They also said it would increase supplies available for manufacturing the war effort during WW1. It has been in place ever since – despite criticism from some groups.

Some critics argue BST should be completely abolished and Britain should operate on GMT permanently. They argue there is little practical gain from changing the time twice a year and the process is disruptive to schools and business.

Permissive Footpath

The permissive footpath on S.G. Danby & Sons' Brickyard Farm, off Gold Fen Bank, has been available for public use for 10 years from 1st October 2009.

This access forms part of a High Level Environmental Stewardship Scheme due to end 30th September 2019.

The farm has the option of continuing to allow access or closing the path.

There has been a small annual payment towards maintaining the path. This will, of course, cease if access continues.

For the time being free use of the path will be allowed to continue, but the farm has the right to close it at any time. If such a decision is made notices will be erected at both access points advising the date well before the time, as well as an entry in this publication and in a local paper.

This permissive path will <u>NOT</u> become a Public Footpath.

Borough Councillor Pickett had nothing to report

The County Councillor reported:

The Highway 'walkabout' will take place on Tuesday 19 November from 9.30am, the itinerary is to be sorted out. Lade Bank and Cragmere Lane, together with other roads to be listed will be looked at by the Highways Officer. Flooding issues at Main Road are being looked at for suggestions to be considered to try and prevent it happening again. (The Parish Council will write to the Drainage Board regarding the drainage between Judgate and Chapel Lane.) Details of any vulnerable residents can be given to the County Councillor who can then assist in getting help to residents where required. Adult learning in Lincolnshire has been rated 'good'. IT in local libraries will be improved. GCSE and A Level results across Lincolnshire are good.

The Directional Sign at Common Road/Main Road Junction

The post will be removed and taken away for sand blasting, when this has been done measurements will be made for the new fingers to be fitted, a local company will be asked to make them. The wording will be discussed when other signs have been looked at.

<u>Highways</u>

There is a loose drain cover in the Main Road, this was reported by County Cllr Skinner at the meeting. The white lines are still missing between Camms Lane and the 30mph sign by the Primary School, this has been reported to LCC. The public footpath from Church Close to the recreation field slopes badly towards the dyke, LCC will be asked to sort this matter out.
